I wonder what the father thought, night after night, perhaps planted at his window, in



hopes that his lost son, the Prodigal, would return. He must've worried about his son's health – whether he was eating regularly; whether he'd gotten injured or fallen ill – even whether he was still alive. He probably questioned himself, wondering whether he had done the right thing. Perhaps he should have denied his son's request and demanded that he stay at home rather than give him his inheritance prematurely. That way, at least, he would know that his son was safe.

As I reflected on Jesus' parable, I was struck by the

father's wisdom. Imagine how the story might have ended had he not given in to his son's request. The son would have lived at home for the rest of his father's life, no doubt growing embittered and resentful with every passing day. When his father ultimately passed away and he received his inheritance, he might well have gone through that same prodigal experience and squandered all of his wealth – but, this time, without a safety net to catch him. When, desperate and destitute, he finally came to his senses, it would have been too late, with his father gone and his older brother not one to forgive and forget.

I sometimes wish that our heavenly Father would rein in our wandering spirits and coerce us to live under his wise, righteous laws. However, God, in his wisdom, recognizes that coerced obedience is not redemptive, so, like the father in the parable, he gives us the latitude to go our own way. Also like the father, in his boundless love an mercy, he stands waiting to welcome us back into his household if we only come to our senses.

Remember that Revelation 3:20, "behold, I stand at the door and knock," was written to the church. It is not only those outside the church who turn their backs from God's wisdom and choose their own way. Christians also make choices, in the short and long term, that either affirm or reject God's perfect path. In those times of rebellion, we must not misinterpret God's forbearance for his approval. Often, he is merely waiting for us to come to our senses and return to his arms of grace.

Do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, forbearance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance?
