Do me a favor: Stop and take a look at your surroundings, concentrating on seeing what you don't ordinarily see. Right now, for example, I'm sitting in my home office, which is, to put it charitably, rather cluttered. Somehow, as I work here day to day, I manage to ignore the mess all around me. Unless I'm trying to find something that's been buried in the debris, I can blind myself to everything other than my screen, keyboard and mouse.

Humans have the amazing ability to filter out information. Were it not so, we would be overwhelmed by all the details. If you've ever taken a walk with a young child, you're probably familiar with the experience of having to stop and examine every little detail — small, insignificant things that you no longer notice but which are rife for exploration to a

young, inexperienced and inquisitive mind. They're still amazed by things that we've trained our minds not to see.

When I first moved to Philadelphia, living in Center City, I was shocked to see homeless people every time I left my apartment. I'm ashamed to say that, over time, my mind learned to filter them out, rendering them as just part of the landscape. Apparently, the homeless can tell the difference, too: As a wide-eyed, newly minted Philadelphian I was constantly hit up for change, but, now that I'm perceived as a hardened city dweller, entreaties come far less often. This is not something that I'm proud of.



In Genesis 18, the Lord told Abraham, "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sin so grievous that I will go down and see if what they have done is as bad as the outcry that has reached me." And what was their grievous sin? God later spelled it out: "Now this was the sin of your sister Sodom: She and her daughters were arrogant, overfed and unconcerned; they did not help the poor and needy." (Ezekiel 16:49)

I won't claim to know the solution to the crisis of need at home and and throughout the world, but I can't ignore what God is saying to me. No longer can I remain arrogant and unconcerned, doing nothing for the needy, while I live with more than enough. Lord, restore my vision and soften my heart.
