We rescued Coco three years ago, when she was about ten months old. Over the the last three years, we've come to know a lot about each other. Coco's main motivations are eating, keeping us (and herself) safe, and resting. In addition to these, she also likes to please us. This can be a tricky pursuit for her, because she doesn't really understand us. She does her best, taking cues from our body language ("Are they going upstairs or staying downstairs?"), our tone of voice ("Are they excited or angry?"), and the few English words she understands.

As Christians, we should be similarly motivated, wanting to please our Lord. When we're new in Christ, we may struggle over how to do this, because we don't always really understand where God is leading. You've heard the phrase, "God works in mysterious ways his wonders to perform" – but are his ways really mysterious? To the Christian who has matured in discipleship, they shouldn't be. Shortly before Jesus laid down his life for us, he explained to his disciples, "I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you."



How do we come to know God's business? We do it the same way that the disciples did, by spending time with him, participating in what he does and paying attention to what he says. And, how do we come to understand what God is saying? The same way that we came to understand what our parents were saying: by listening. When we were babies, our parents' words were just sounds, but we quickly learned. First, we learned to distinguish the sound of their voices. Then, over time, we learned to recognize our names, and we to recognize when they were talking to us. Bit by bit, we built up our vocabulary, until what they said made sense to us, and until, eventually, we were even able to respond.

God wants to have conversations with you. It's the whole reason that he created people! Discipline yourself to listen to his voice — in prayer, in Bible study and in church. You will find delight in dialoguing with the Creator!

Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening. (I Samuel 3:9)
