We must not be too embarrassed to come to God after we have messed up, nor should we fear rejection: He loves us. And we need not hold things in for fear of burdening him with our problems: He cares for us, and wants us to cast all our cares on him. (I Peter 5:7)

In this, as in all areas, Jesus is our example. May we be so loving as to convince others that they can be drop their masks and be honest with us. And may we be so caring that others will feel liberty share their burdens with us. In God's plan, we're all in this together: all parts of one body, working in unison in the service of the same Head.
