A few years ago, we converted our house into a "smart home." Since then, we no longer flip light switches. For example, there's a motion sensor in our kitchen, and, when someone walks in, it turns out the light. When the room is unoccupied, it turns the light off. At first, we had to unlearn the reflex of reaching for a light switch when we enter and leave the room, but now it's become so routine that I actually find myself surprised when I walk into the kitchen at church and the light doesn't turn on!



It's very easy to take artificial light for granted, and, yet, for most of human history, the world was a very dark place after the sun went down. There are still places in this world — and in this country — where, if lighting on demand is available at all, it's a luxury. It only takes one prolonged power outage to show us just how precious the gift of light.

I'm sure you can see where I'm going with this.

As Christians, we don't have to walk in darkness, and, as we cling to Jesus, we might even forget what it's like not to be surrounded by his light, or even take that light for granted. I do hope and pray that Christians would never stray from our Lord and find ourselves stumbling in darkness. His light should be an expected and routine part of our lives. Let us not forget, though, that there are many all around us who suffer in darkness. This should not be, because, wherever we go, we should carry God's light with us.

God said through Isaiah that his people were to be, "I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." God gives us light not just to benefit us, but, what's more important, to bless those living in darkness and, ultimately, that he would be glorified. This is not a difficult calling. It requires only that we don't cover up our light or keep it hidden. We don't have to worry about how effective we will be; light by its nature dispels darkness. Our light should be like the lights in my kitchen, shining automatically, whenever we walk into a room.

I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. You are the light of the world. Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. (Matthew 5:14, 16; John 8:12)
