The gentlemen asked when our worship service started, and they seemed very interested. I have to admit that I wasn't surprised that none of them came back for it. And that's okay.

Let's be clear: Our neighbors' greatest need is salvation, but that doesn't mean that we ignore their other needs. We don't show kindness merely as a means to an end. While we certainly hoped that breakfast would have been a lead-in for us to tell them about Jesus, we're just glad that we were send them off with a little bit of breakfast that morning.

Jesus acknowledged that there were people who followed him only because of the loaves and fish. He fed them anyway, because he loved them. If our kindness comes begrudgingly or with expectations, can we really say that we're walking in his love?


