What's your favorite parable? It's hard to choose just one, isn't it? One of my favorites is found in the last chapter of Jonah. You remember the story: Jonah was sitting out in the hot sun, angry that God accepted Nineveh's repentance rather than destroying the city. For a time, God provided a vine to shield Jonah from the heat, but when the vine was chewed by a worm and died, Jonah was so angry that he wished that he were dead. God then delivered the moral of the parable, contrasting Jonah's ridiculous mourning over the death of a plant with his lack of concern for the thousands of Ninevites.

When God was on earth in bodily form, he used words to relate parables. In Acts 10, he used a vision in the parable that he shared to change Peter's attitude towards Gentiles. To me, though, the most amazing parables by far are the ones that God, who created and controls everything, weaves together out of living beings and real events, as he did with Jonah — and as he does with us!

Through parables, Jesus taught about the kingdom of heaven and the folly of pursuing earthly things, illustrated the foolishness of people's attitudes and priorities, and nudged people forward in faith, love and true repentance. These are things he still wants to communicate.



Has God ever orchestrated events around you to deliver a message of encouragement, or one of correction? I believe that God speaks to us in parables more often than we realize. Remember that Jesus prefaced his explanation of the parable of the sower by telling his disciples that its meaning was hidden from most of the people who heard it, who were "ever hearing and never understanding." (Matthew I3:I4)

Let us practice listening for God's voice; acknowledging his presence in all our ways. Instead of lamenting the reversals and setbacks that come to us, or the ruts that we seem to get stuck in, let's practice asking, "God, what lesson do you have for me in this?"

Let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance.

(Proverbs 1:5)
