As Moses wrote, our life is built on every word that comes from the mouth of God. I was reminded of the significance of every word this past week, as I read these verses in Luke 22:

³¹ "Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift all of you as wheat. ³² But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. (...)" ³³ But he replied, "Lord, I am ready to go with you to prison and to death." ³⁴ Jesus answered, "I tell you, Peter, before the rooster crows today, you will deny three times that you know me."

Three times, Jesus referred to him as Simon, before switching, the fourth time, to the name Peter.

Who was Simon? Simon was the fisherman who, seeing Jesus' miracle-working power, fell to his knees and confessed, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man." (Luke 5:8) Peter, by contrast, was the fisher of men, so named after he confessed what God had revealed to him – that Jesus was the Messiah. (Matthew 16:17,18)



When Satan attacks, he attacks our old selves; the people we *were*—insecure in who we are and counting ourselves unworthy of being in the presence of God. In the verses from Luke, Jesus invoked that old, insecure person three times by using the name Simon, as Simon went on to deny him three times.

But Jesus was praying for Simon!

In the end, Jesus used the name Peter, signaling to Peter that he would emerge on the other side of failure as the rock that Jesus had declared him to be: Unshakeable! Immovable!

When fears and doubts attack you, remember that Jesus is praying for you, because he always lives to intercede for us! (Hebrews 7:25) When he prays, he calls us by our new names, seeing us for who truly we are in him, even when we stumble.

Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?

(Isaiah 43:18,19)


