

There's an interesting incident in Daniel's life where he prayed and humbled himself for 21 days without hearing from God. When an angel finally appeared bearing God's response, he told Daniel that he had been sent from the moment that Daniel had started praying but had been resisted the entire time by the Prince of Persia.

I've told my Sunday school classes that our Christian walk is more like tennis than golf. In golf, our results are, pretty much, based on us; our preparation, our talent and our training. Tennis is different, though, because we have an opponent. Even when we do everything right, we still have to battle for a good result – and success is not always guaranteed.

After last week's newsletter went print, I regretted having included the last line of my commentary: If we're not receiving God's wisdom, it's not because he's unwilling, but only because we haven't bothered to ask.

That was a simplistic and incorrect statement which ignores the fact that we need to contend for the faith. It also overlooks another simple but crucial fact of our Christian lives: Sometimes, we have to wait while God forms his answer within us.

Among mammals, the record for the shortest pregnancy goes to the Virginian opossum, which goes from conception to birth in 12 to 13 days. By contrast, human pregnancies are measured in

months, and elephant pregnancies are measured in years! The larger and more complex the animal, the longer the period of gestation. Similarly, while we can receive insight on small matters in a rather short amount of time, it takes a while for wisdom to be born. Wisdom, after all, comes from experience, and experience comes with time. We might not even recognize that God is imparting wisdom to us – just as a married couple doesn't realize that a baby is



forming in the mother's womb until a few weeks after conception. Even after pregnancy is confirmed, and even with modern imaging technology, it takes a while for what has been conceived to become visible. All the while, things are progressing, and waiting is a normal and healthy part of the process.

In short, and in contrast to what I said before, if you've sought God for wisdom, don't despair over the wait. He has promised to give it to us, and he is faithful.

For the revelation awaits an appointed time ... and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay. (Habakkuk 2:3)
