We're in the middle of one of my favorite seasons: Hardcourt tennis season! I love watching tennis, and seeing a match in person at the US Open is on my bucket list.

If you've watched a lot of tennis, you may have noticed that, whenever a tennis player falls, he tosses his racket away from his body. It's easy to understand why: If a player falls while holding a racket and that racket hits the ground first, the player could jam or dislocate his shoulder. However, throwing the racket to the side isn't a natural reaction to falling. It's something that players practice over and over again so that, if they fall during a point, they don't even have to think about it.

Professional tennis players don't play with the fear that that they're going to fall. That would make them tentative, afraid to go after balls, and would cost them a lot of games. And no one lunges for a shot thinking, "Well, this is the time I'm going to trip over my feet and fall down." Still, they practice falling because they know that, with the amount of time they spend on court, sooner or later, they're going to fall.

As followers of Jesus, we can't pursue our Christian walk with a constant fear of falling into sin, nor should we expect to fall on any given day or in any given circumstance. At the same time, though, we must acknowledge that, as humans, we are inevitably going to fall, and, since we know that, we need to discipline ourselves so that we can respond well when a fall happens.

When we fall, Satan is quick to swoop in. His goal is to keep us from praying, by telling us that we're not worthy to be in God's presence, and to keep us from fellowship with other believers, saying that saying that, if we go to church, people are going to condemn us and gossip about us. It is our spiritual disciplines, developed in advance, that keep us from doing more damage when we fall.

Commit yourself to daily prayer and Bible study and to fellowship with believers. Build up those routines so that, whatever setbacks come your way, you have something solid to fall back on.

Now devote your heart and soul to seeking the Lord your God.


