Have you ever eaten an acorn? I only recently learned that they're actually edible! They're not really meant for human consumption, though. It takes several days, through a complicated process, to remove all of the toxins from acorns, and the only reward is a bitter tasting side dish.



In Isaiah 6I (the chapter from which Jesus read in the temple), the prophet writes that those whom the Lord delivers will be called oaks of righteousness. I have to think that, if God had wanted to use a fruit to represent righteousness, he would have chosen something other than an oak tree's acorns. After all, elsewhere in Scripture, he uses fig trees and grape vines in his examples. I think the righteousness that God is speaking of relates to the other thing that oak trees produce: oxygen.

When we breathe, we absorb oxygen from the air and exhale carbon dioxide as waste. This sounds a lot like some people I know (and I'm sure you know some, too), who take what's good out of the things that they're given and give out toxicity in return! However nice or generous you may be to them, they respond with ingratitude, bitterness and complaints. Just as it is not the nature of the body to exhale oxygen into the world, it is not the nature of human beings to release righteousness back into the world.

Trees, by contrast, absorb the toxic carbon dioxide and give out oxygen. That's what God calls us to do! Being an oak of righteousness is not just about producing righteousness; God also calls us to absorb the unrighteousness that surrounds us. As God's agents, we should defuse anger, speak up for those who are being mistreated and decrease the level of hatred in the world around us. We must absorb the curse and respond with blessing.

The oaks of righteousness, Isaiah goes on to say, are, "a planting of the Lord, for the display of his splendor." Wherever you are, God has planted you there with a purpose. Even if your situation is not be ideal, recognize that God has planted you there to show off his splendor.

Bless those who persecute you, bless and do not curse.
