THE CROSS and CROWN

"No Cross, No Crown"

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I love the parables that Jesus shared with real lives rather than words. Notice the juxtaposition that John gives us in chapters 8 and 9. In John 8:12, he records Jesus' declaration, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." It's in the very next chapter that John tells us about the time when Jesus healed a man born blind; — illustrating the truth that he had just declared by bringing light to a man who had walked in darkness all his life. This was a parable in the truest sense: a heavenly truth related in earthly terms.

Our experience of darkness is quite different than that of the people who heard Jesus' declaration. For them, the night brought an end to all activity. Our ability to travel long distances and to work productively at night would have been inconceivable to them, as it was throughout much of human history. It's not surprising that the Bible is full of references to God and his Word as light, given how much of an impediment the darkness was. God defied this impediment in Moses' day, when he provided a cloud of fire by night to guide the Israelites on their way. This was another living parable: "a lamp for their feet and a light for their path," foretelling what Jesus, the Word, brought when he came into the world.

Jesus, in turn, called us the light of the world. I like the saying, "It's better to light a candle than to curse the darkness," but Jesus took it one step further and told us to *be* the candle!

It's true in our day as it was in Jesus' day: We live in a dark world. That's all the more reason for us not to hide our light away or keep it to ourselves. We must be, as Jesus was, the light that overcomes the darkness.

The path of the righteous is like the morning sun, shining ever brighter till the full light of day. (Proverbs 4:18)
